Whilst we are proud of all of our students' achievements, the following students deserve recognition for achieving top grades across a range of different subjects:

- Jeff B who achieved the top grades of 8-9 across a range of subjects, including grade 9s in Mathematics and Science
- Harrison C who achieved top grades 7-9 across a range of subjects, including a grade 9 in Mathematics and grade 8s in Science
- Kun Jun P who achieved top grades 7-9 across a range of subjects
- Gabriella T-B who achieved top grades 7-9 across a range of subjects
- Viki A who achieved top grades 7-9 across a range of subjects, including a grade 8 in Mathematics and grades 9/8 in Science
- Bertie R who achieved top grades 7-9 across a range of subjects

In total, a quarter of all grades were grade 7 or above, across subjects.

These exceptional grades follow on from a stunning year for the school in which it was visited by both Ofsted, and SIAMS (an inspection focused on the impact of the Christian vision on pupils and adults within the school community). Both of these inspections resulted in secure 'Good' gradings in the new, challenging frameworks.

The school's vision is geared around promoting self-worth in students to inspire them to live well, achieve their goals and be a force for good both in school and the world beyond. Our Year 11 Class of 2022 have proved, unequivocally, that the school's vision is alive and kicking!
