St Mark's School works most closely with Hayesfield Girls' School and Beechen Cliff, as part of the Bath Hub. All three schools share good practice so that students achieve their aspirations and personal growth through a high quality curriculum offer and a wide range of exciting and engaging opportunities. Our common goal is to ensure our students have an excellent experience of secondary school.

Our desire to inspire all students for future success is extended through our post 16 partnerships with the Hayesfield Mixed Sixth, Beechen Cliff Sixth Form, and the New Sixth, as well as other local sixth forms and colleges. We also enjoy strong partnerships with local businesses, charities, post 16 providers and universities that help promote students' personal development and broaden the opportunities that are available to them.

# The start of an amazing journey



St Mark's takes children from over twenty different primary schools across Bath, Bristol and Wiltshire so we are passionate about ensuring that the transition from primary to secondary is enjoyable and informative. Our dedicated tutor team will support your child as they prepare for and then settle into their first year with us.

We begin primary transition work in the March of Year 6 with our Friendship Afternoon. We see this event as the very beginning of the exciting journey your child will take from being a Year 6 pupil to becoming a confident young adult ready to be a force for good in the world. During this afternoon, your child will be encouraged to make new friends and to actively experience our school environment.

We host an Induction Day for our students at the beginning of July, which is then followed by a Parent Information Evening and Summer BBQ for our new families. These events provide an opportunity for our new Year 7 pupils and their parents to meet key members of the team and to discover the warm, welcoming atmosphere at our school. We also hold a Summer School at the start of the summer holidays to help prepare our students for the transition to secondary in September.

In Term 1, and as our new students settle into school life and grow confident in their community, we provide two days of team building activities for our new Year 7 students where they can go out of school, work, play and learn together . Here they will begin to firm up friendships and create the lastings bonds that will support them through their school years. At the end of Year 7, when our students are settled into school life and confident in their community, they are invited to attend a Key Stage 3 Camp as part of our end of school year activity days. This camp helps to cement friendships, widen the scope for educational and fun learning activities and provides students with a sense of accomplishment beyond the classroom.

Sport is an important aspect of life at St Mark's. Your child will be offered a range of sporting fixtures throughout the year in an atmosphere of teamwork and friendship. Performing Arts opportunities allow all of our students to thrive while developing their true identities. The Performing Arts annual production promotes creativity, confidence and independence, allowing all students to explore and develop musical and dramatic talents whilst promoting collaborative working. Students are able to perform in school, in Bath Hub events such as The Battle of the Bands, or to a wider audience across the city such as the Bath Voices celebration held at Bath Abbey.

We understand the importance of taking learning outside of the classroom in order for lessons to come to life. Your child will be able to enjoy a range of trips locally, further afield in the UK and abroad throughout the year. Students enjoy exhilarating and educational trips to Europe to develop their language skills and develop their cultural awareness, as well our ski trip that offers to all our students a fabulous week skiing in the beautiful French Alps.

School Council and student leadership roles provide an active and important opportunity for our students to develop personal skills and confidence that will support them way beyond their school years. Your child will be encouraged to build their leadership skills as part of a School Council, a forum in which all students are expected to actively participate. They can also become a Student Ambassador, a Peer Mentor, or contribute to the development of their school and local communities through a range of projects. In Key Stage 4, your child will have the opportunity to become a Student Leader and Prefect or even become one of our Head Students.

We believe that your child will reach their full academic and personal potential when parents and the school work in partnership. We have a very clear behavior policy, which is underpinned by the school's visions and values, creating a positive ethos that encourages your child to succeed and achieve.

Our Christian values lie at the heart of our ethos and underpins the way we work together as a community. We are guided by Mathew's words "Let your light shine". This sentiment, regarding personnel development and wellbeing of our students, is paramount and central to our educational purpose. We serve equally those of the Christian faith, those of other faiths and those of no faith.

St Mark's School was subject to a two-day SIAMS inspection in December 2021, in a similar process to Ofsted. The Report was full of praise for the work of the school and is well worth a read.

Because St Mark's is a smaller than average sized school, we are often the school of choice for students who feel more at home in a close-knit community. All of our teachers implement strategies that remove barriers to success and use a range of evidence-based interventions to meet the needs of all of our learners. Our holisticand inclusive approach prepares all students for education post-16, the world of work and independent living.

We ensure that all learners feel valued in our school community by celebrating diversity and difference. Partnerships with parents and carers are developed through regular meetings with our Education Support Team, where students are able to share their opinions and viewpoints too.

#### **Resource Bases**

As well as our mainstream provisions for SEN, we have two specialist resource bases, where students are taught by specialists teachers and teaching assistants.

Orchard Lodge is a Moderate Learning Difficulty (MLD) resource base. All of the students in the provision have an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP). The provision at Orchard Lodge is entirely personalised and centred on students' EHCPs. Students undertake learning in a range of environments, developing the skills they require in their preparation for adulthood. The curriculum implementation is based on a primary model, where students are taught the majority of lessons in Key Stage 3 or Key Stage 4 groups. Each student has their own bespoke Personalised Learning Intention Map (PLIM) and attend selected mainstream lessons and other activities such as whole-school assemblies.

In September 2025 we opened a specialist Autism base, Bay Tree Lodge. Here, autistic students with an EHCP are able to access a meaningful and personalised education whilst integrating into a mainstream setting. They will be taught by specialist staff who support children to learn in a non-threatening environment so that they can flourish and grow.

Orchard Lodge and Bay Tree Lodge have bespoke facilities, including 'The Canopy', which is the students' sensory space, kitchen areas and an allotment patch.

#### **MNSP**

St Mark's School is proud to be a member of the Midsomer Norton Schools Partnership (MNSP), a multi-academy trust consisting of approximately 36 schools with over 16,500 pupils on roll. The Trust celebrates our school's individual character and offers outstanding support to St Mark's. It also challenges us so we can continue our journey to excellence by building on our successes. All schools within the MNSP benefit from sharing expertise and resources with other schools.



#### **Bath Hub**

St Mark's School works closely with Hayesfield Girls' School and Beechen Cliff School as part of the Bath Hub within the MNSP Trust. All three schools share good practice so that students have high aspirations and experience personal growth through a high quality curriculum offer and a wide range of exciting and engaging opportunities. Our common goal is to ensure that every child in the city has an excellent experience of secondary education.

The Bath Hub facilitates opportunities for our students to be able to access personal development activities beyond St Mark's School, including performing in concerts and showcases as well as participating in social activities such as lower school discos and trips to Legoland with pupils from all three schools!

# A caring and progressive leadership team

The Senior Leadership Team (SLT) at St Mark's is the driving force behind the school's success. Our core purpose is to provide the strong leadership and effective management necessary to create a thriving and effective learning environment for every student in our school.

The SLT members have responsibility for a range of specific areas including Curriculum, Teaching and Learning, Pastoral and Inclusion, SEND, Assessment and Data.

Our roles are multifaceted but in essence, it is our responsibility to ensure that the strategic direction of the school is set, monitored and evaluated in order that the school runs smoothly so that all students have the opportunity to reach their full potential.
